Mission

Fairhaven House provides low cost housing with utilities included. Laundry service is available at no extra charge.

We hold weekly group meetings pertaining to sobriety, and recovery.

The discipleship program teaches and helps residents learn how to transition into independent living situations so they can effectively live and work with others. We accomplish this by program guidelines, a structured environment, an atmosphere of respect and honor, and by applying Biblical principles that will help individuals to grow spiritually.

Our program encourages 12-step meetings, church attendance, and sponsorship/mentorship support to help meet the spiritual and emotional needs of participants. We also connect our residents to outside support services, treatment facilities, and counseling if needed.

Fairhaven House offers ministry opportunities for those who desire to reach out to the local community.

FAIRHAVEN HOUSE

Housing

Members of Fairhaven House Discipleship Program pay membership dues for low income housing which includes utilities and laundry service. Dues are paid on a monthly basis. Fairhaven House offers shared and private sleeping facilities. Price range is \$330-\$400 (subject to change).

Fairhaven House has two homes- *Valley Ridge* located on Military Rd. in Seatac and *Flight Path* located on S. 150th St. in Seatac.

Fairhaven House has a zero tolerance regarding the possession and/or use of alcohol or drugs. Effective January 1, 2010, there will be no smoking at the Fairhaven House facilities (individuals may smoke off the premises).

Fairhaven House has a midnight curfew. Individuals may come and go as they desire. After the first 30-days individuals may leave the premises up to 48 hrs with prior approval.

Currently Fairhaven House is offering housing only for men. In the future we hope to have a home specifically for women.

FAIRHAVEN HOUSE

Intake

Qualifications:

To become a member of Fairhaven House a potential candidate must have recently graduated from an alcohol/drug treatment facility (there are exceptions for those who are currently enrolled in an outpatient treatment program).

Candidates must be involved in a sponsor/mentor relationship in a 12-Step or church program. Otherwise, the Program Director will help initiate a mentoring program for the candidate.

Non-Discrimination:

Fairhaven House does not discriminate against individuals based upon race, color, religion, national origin, age, or familial status.

Intake Process:

Candidates must meet all entry requirements, fill out an application, undergo a criminal background investigation, and agree to abide by all Fairhaven House guidelines.

Approved candidates will be required to provide a financial budget, subject to review on a regular basis by the Program Director.
