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Mission

Fairhaven House provides faith-based clean & sober transitional housing at an affordable rate.

We hold weekly group meetings pertaining to sobriety, and recovery.

The discipleship program teaches, and helps members learn, how to transition into independent living situations so they can effectively live and work with others. We accomplish this by program guidelines, a structured environment, an atmosphere of respect and honor, and by applying Biblical principles that will help individuals to grow spiritually.

Our program encourages 12-step meetings, church attendance, and sponsorship/mentorship support to help meet the spiritual and emotional needs of participants. We also connect our residents to outside support services, treatment facilities, and counseling if needed.

Fairhaven House offers service opportunities for those who desire to reach out to the local community. There is fulfillment when a person reaches out to others.

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Housing

Members of Fairhaven House Discipleship Program pay membership dues for low income housing which includes Wireless Internet, Cable TV, home phone, and laundry facilities. Dues are paid on a monthly basis. Fairhaven House offers shared and private sleeping facilities (studio, single, double occupancy). Price range is \$500-\$750 (subject to change) . There is a \$200 deposit, \$100 refundable.

Fairhaven House has two homes for men-one house in Seatac, WA, one house in Burien, WA. One home for women in Seatac, WA, and one basement unit in Seattle, WA for families.

Fairhaven House has a zero tolerance regarding the possession and/or use of alcohol or drugs, nicotine, gambling, or the viewing of pornography. There is random alcohol/drug/nicotine testing.

Fairhaven House has a 11pm curfew. After the first 30-days individuals may leave the premises up to 48hrs with prior approval.

Fairhaven House does not accept individuals on Methadone, but does accept a limited amount of individuals on Suboxone.

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Intake

Qualifications:

To become a member of Fairhaven House a potential candidate must have recently graduated from an alcohol/drug treatment facility. There are exceptions for those who are serious about living a life of sobriety. We do not take individuals with warrants.

Candidates must be involved in a sponsor/mentor relationship in a 12-Step or other program. Otherwise, the Executive Director will help initiate a mentoring program for the candidate.

Non-Discrimination:

Fairhaven House does not discriminate against individuals based upon race, color, religion, national origin, age, or sexual orientation.

Intake Process:

Candidates must meet all entry requirements, fill out an application, undergo a criminal background investigation, and agree to abide by all Fairhaven House guidelines.

Candidates must have a source of income.

We accept DOC vouchers, HEN, ABD.
